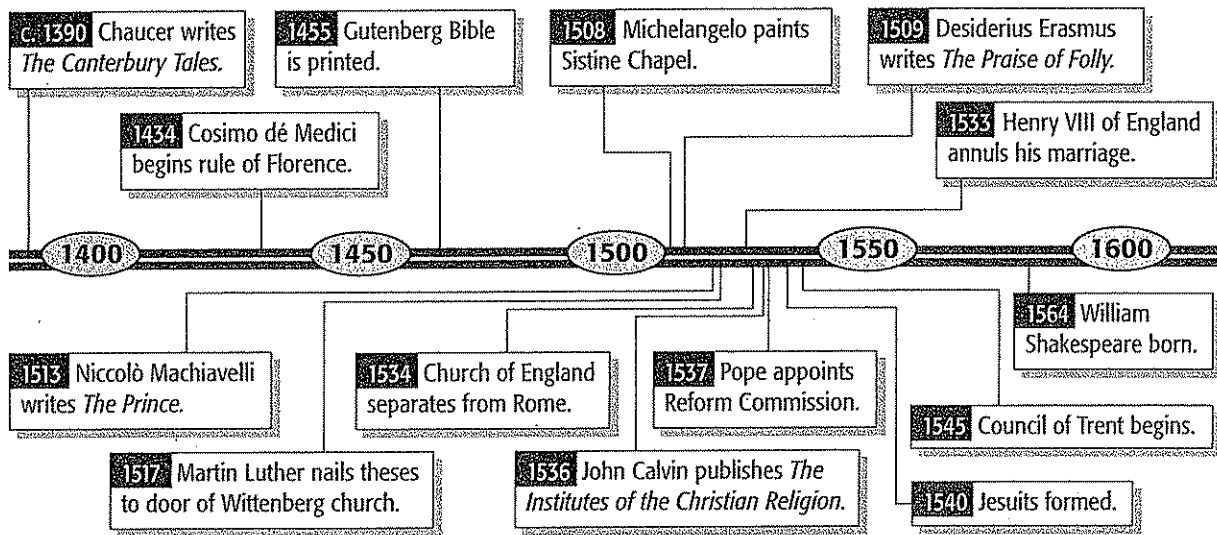


Time Line Activity 12
